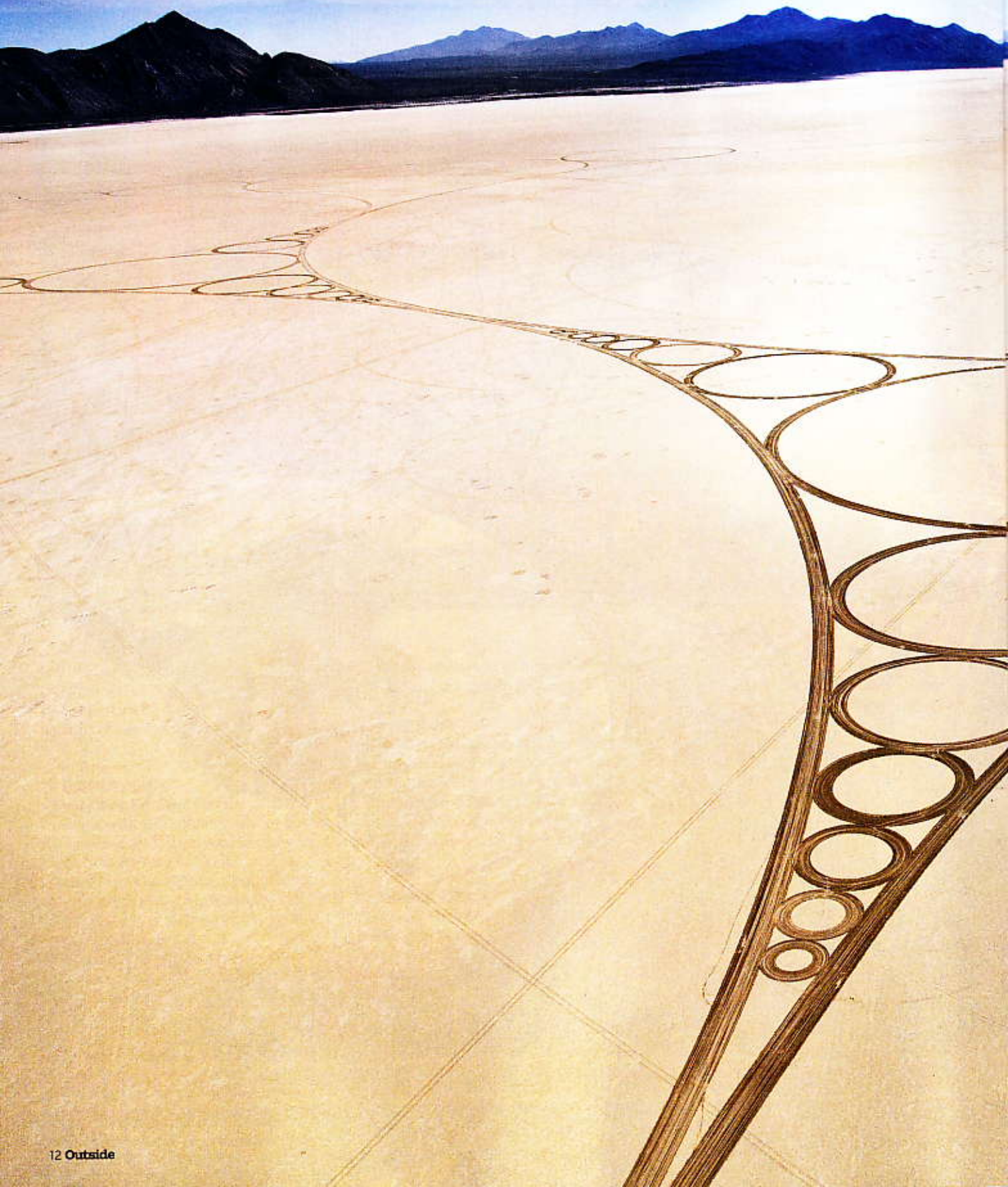

On a dry lake bed in Nevada's Black Rock Desert, in May 2009, landscape artist Jim Denevan created what's been billed as the largest drawing in the world. It contained more than 1,000 circles and, when complete, was wider than Manhattan. San Francisco Bay Area-based Hinson captured the partially finished design, which was composed by dragging chain-link fencing across the dirt, from a single-engine plane. "There were four of us living out of an old touring bus for two weeks," says Denevan. "After it was finished, people flying from London to San Francisco e-mailed saying they saw it perfectly while up in the air." The dot at the near edge of the large inner circle? That's Denevan's bus. **THE TOOLS:** Canon 5D Mark II, 24–105mm f/4 lens, ISO 200, f/5, 1/5,000 second
